#### **KEADBY II POWER STATION, TRENT SIDE, KEADBY, NORTH LINCOLNSHIRE**

Notice is hereby given that Keadby Developments Limited (the 'Applicant') has made an application (the 'Variation Application') to the Secretary of State for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy (the 'Appropriate Authority') under Section 36C of The Electricity Act 1989 to vary the consent granted on 4 November 2016 (the '2016 Consent') for the construction and operation of a combined cycle gas turbine ('CCGT') generating station with an electrical output of up to 820 megawatts ('MW'), known as Keadby II Power Station (the 'Consented Development') on land at the existing Keadby I Power Station, Trent Side, Keadby North Lincolnshire (the 'Site').

The Variation Application requests that the Appropriate Authority consents to vary the 2016 Consent to allow the Applicant to construct and operate a CCGT generating station with an electrical output of up to 910 MW at the Site in order to deliver higher efficiency electricity generation (the 'Proposed Development'). The consent (the 'Variation Consent') if granted, would also allow for a number of design changes to the Consented Development, including in relation to the location of the emissions stack, building dimensions and appearance and the removal of supplementary firing.

The Proposed Development is Environmental Impact Assessment ('EIA') development and therefore the Application documents include an EIA Report and Non-Technical Summary that describe its likely significant environmental effects in comparison to those for the Consented Development.

The Applicant has received notice under Regulation 4(6) of the Variation Regulations dated 8 August 2017 that the Appropriate Authority considers the Variation Application to be suitable for publication. The Applicant is therefore publishing notice of the Variation Application in accordance with Regulation 5(3) & (5) of the Variation Regulations and Regulation 22(4) & (5) of the 2017 EIA Regulations.

Should the Applicant provide any further environmental information to the Appropriate Authority, the Applicant will publish a notice in accordance with Regulation 26 of the 2017 EIA Regulations stating how that information may be inspected and copies obtained, the address that any objections or representations must be sent to and the date (no earlier than 30 days after the last notice is published) by which any such objections or representations must be submitted. The further environmental information will be made available free of charge on the Application website and at the venues listed above.

Pursuant to Regulation 8 of the Variation Regulations the Appropriate Authority may cause a public inquiry to be held into the Variation Application if it considers it appropriate to do so having considered:

- (a) any representations made about the Variation Application to the Appropriate Authority-
  - (i) which a relevant planning authority makes within two months of the date on which a copy of the Variation Application was served on it under Regulation 5(2)(b) of the Variation Regulations; and
  - (ii) which any other person makes on or before the date specified in accordance with Regulation 5(5)(b)(iii) of the Variation Regulations, where those representations are not withdrawn; and
- (b) all other material considerations.

The Appropriate Authority may consent to vary the 2016 Consent or may refuse consent to vary that consent.
